TO: Adopt-A-Shoreline Volunteers

The Big Bear Municipal Water District's Adopt-A-Shoreline program is designed to have volunteers adopt a section of the lake shoreline and help keep that specific area clean throughout the season. Volunteers are provided caps, trash bags, gloves, trash-pickers and T-shirts. Bagged trash for is left roadside and later picked up by our maintenance crews for disposal. Please notify the District of the locations of bagged trash to be picked up at 909-866-5796. Volunteers are able to work their own schedules. Individuals, groups, schools or businesses are welcome to participate. This is an excellent opportunity for kids, adults and community groups to participate in a great outdoor activity, help the environment, and keep Big Bear Lake's 22 miles of shoreline free of debris and trash.

Please consider the following safety issues when working around the Lake:

- Use common sense when working around the shoreline of the Lake. If an object is too heavy to lift, get help or call the District and advise us of the location of the debris.
- Do not work at night and stop work before dusk.
- Do not work in bad weather. During thunderstorms, lightning can strike anywhere around the Lake.
- Avoid over exertion and drink plenty of water.
- If you find something around the shore that you cannot identify, call the District and do not touch it.
- Advise the District of the location of any potentially hazardous materials such as powders, chemicals, weapons, sharp objects, or dead animals.
